## Sponsor Letters/Requirements

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. Be at least 16 years of age. Have completed the Sacraments of Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation). If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. You must be registered with our parish for at least 3 months before we will provide a sponsor letter. Although you may have registered with our parish, if you are not attending Mass regularly and using the envelope system there is no way for the parish office to confirm regular Mass attendance. Please contact the Parish Office to confirm your status with our parish.

## Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament

Jesus chooses to come to us under the appearance of bread because bread is made from wheat. Wheat is beaten, broken and crushed before it becomes bread. Jesus was willing to be beaten at the pillar, broken in Heart, and crushed in humiliation that He may be for us "the Living Bread come down from Heaven." His words to St. Margaret Mary are even more valid today: "Behold this Heart which has so loved men and which is so little loved in return... I thirst with such a terrible thirst to beloved by men in this sacrament of my love." Jesus anxiously awaits a visit from you, here in our Church, every Wednesday between 3 & 6PM... Come & Behold, the lamb of God...

**Homily Reflections:** Each student must write 14 Homily Reflections as follows: A minimum of 9 Masses throughout the year as well as 3 Mandatory Masses together with Christmas and Easter Masses. (*Minimum Total of 14 Homily Reflections.*) This is not saying you only have to attend Mass 14 times a year. Sundays are a Holy Day of Obligation and Practicing Catholics are required to attend weekly Mass and all Holy Days.



The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process by which adults who would like to become Catholic, or Catholic adults who would like to receive all of their Sacraments are able to do so. ### Gospel: Mark 7:31-37

Some people brought a deaf man who could not speak to Jesus and begged him to lay his hand on the man. Jesus opened the man's ears and cured his speech impediment. He ordered the people not to tell anyone, but they were too amazed to keep this to themselves.

"And people brought to him a deaf man who had a speech impediment and begged him to lay his hands on him. He took him off by himself away from the crowd. He put a finger into the man's ears and, spitting, touched his tongue, then he looked up to heaven and groaned and said to him, 'Ephphatha' - that is, 'Be opened!' And immediately his ears were opened, his speech impediment was removed, and he spoke plainly... 'He has done all things well. He makes the deaf hear and the mute speak.'"

One on one with Jesus, apart from the crowd. Touch, saliva, a spoken word, a cure. At my baptism, the minister repeated these steps saying, 'As Jesus made the deaf to hear and the mute to speak, so may He open your ears to hear His word and sing His praise.' What would it be like if the people had just passed the person by, leaving him with his impediment? They didn't but begged Jesus to do something.

The next time you see a person signing at a news conference on TV, think about Jesus healing this person. The next time you meet a disabled person, do not pass them by, but pray and consider what you can do to assist him or her. 'Be opened' to the possibility of having one meet the healing Jesus through your hands and care.

Today is also the celebration of the birthday of our Blessed Mother. We celebrate three birthdays – the birth of Jesus, the birth of John the Baptist on June 24th and Mary.
