Although you may have registered with our parish, if you are not attending Mass regularly and using the envelope system there is no way for the parish office to confirm regular Mass attendance. Please contact the Parish Office to confirm your status with our parish.



What is Eucharistic Adoration?

Eucharistic Adoration is the act of worshiping God as He is present in the consecrated Eucharist. Since the Last Supper, when Jesus broke the bread and distributed the wine, saying "This is My body and This is My Blood," Catholics have believed that the bread & wine are no longer merely baked wheat and fermented grape juice, but the actual living presence of the Second Person of the Trinity: Jesus! "We have come to do Him homage" Those were the words spoken by the magi from the East as they searched for the infant Jesus. That is what is on the hearts & minds of many people as they make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament.







Gospel: John 21:1-19

Jesus appeared to the disciples for the third time since his resurrection while they were fishing. They hadn't caught anything, and then Jesus advised them to cast their net from the other side of the boat. When they did this, they caught a great number of fish. Jesus then asked Peter three times, "Do you love me?" When Peter said he did, Jesus asked him to tend and feed his sheep.

"When they climbed out on shore, they saw a charcoal fire with fish on it and bread, Jesus said to them, 'Bring some of the fish you just caught.' So Simon Peter went over and dragged the net ashore, full of one hundred fifty three large fish. Even though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them: 'Come, have breakfast.' And not one of the disciples dared to ask him, 'who are you', because they realized it was the Lord. Jesus came over and took the bread and gave it to them, and in like manner the fish... This was the third time..."

As He fed the multitude, as He invited the disciples today, so we too are invited to the meal He has prepared for us. The descriptive chapter of John's gospel can help us meditate and live the gospel scene. We are at the seashore, perhaps with a gentle breeze and lapping waves. The aroma of frying fish on the barbecue, charcoal fire fills the air. Jesus asks Simon Peter to share some of his catch. Using familiar words, like those at the Eucharist He took the bread and fish, said a blessing and gave it to them. What a breakfast!

Jesus continues to invite us to His meal, the Eucharist. He knows our hunger and need. He provides what will allow to grow in our spiritual lives, yet we unfortunately rush or don't consider what a great gift and privilege to meet Him, not on the lake shore, but in our parish church. Like the disciples we do not ask who are you, for we know who is both our host and guest.






