#### Sponsor Letters/Requirements

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for **Baptism** Confirmation. Be at least 16 years of age. Have completed the Sacraments of Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation). If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. You must be registered with our parish for at least 3 months before we will provide a sponsor letter. Although you may have registered with our parish, if you are not attending Mass regularly and using the envelope system there is no way for the parish office to confirm regular Mass attendance. Please contact the Parish Office to confirm your status with our parish.



Sundays are a Holy Day of Obligation and Practicing Catholics are required to attend weekly Mass and all Holy Days.

Gospel: John 20:19-23

Jesus appeared to the disciples even though they had locked the doors in fear. Jesus then showed the disciples his hands and his side; and they rejoiced at his presence. He breathed on them saying "Receive the Holy Spirit." He then gave the disciples the power to forgive others or hold them accountable for their sins.

"Jesus stood up and exclaimed: 'Let anyone who thirsts come to me and drink. As Scripture says: Rivers of living water will flow from within him who believes in me.' He said this in reference to the Spirit that those who came to believe in him were to receive. There was, of course, no Spirit yet, because Jesus had not yet been glorified."

Pentecost – wind, noise, tongues of fire, signs with which we are familiar. The coming of the Spirit brought radical change. In the Acts of the Apostles, the question was asked, 'have you received the Holy Spirit?' Did the advent of the Spirit produce radical change in living my faith?

Pentecost scripture readings are many and varied, but the underlying question is, 'am I being led by the Spirit?' If I am, I am a child of God and have been adopted, and so I can call God 'Abba', Father. May the Holy Spirit and the gifts He brought direct me this day and every day.









### Birthdays come with gifts!

Follow these directions to turn the cross into a gift box.

Color then cut on dotted lines - fold on light, solid lines into gift box, tape edges together, then the remaining edges.



Jesus died on the cross out of love for us. This same love gives us the Gifts of the Spirit to help us on our journey as disciples of Christ.







Color the bow red; **RED** is the color of Pentecost, the vestments of the priest and the color people wear to signify the **LOVE** and **FIRE** of the **SPIRIT**.

The request to remember a loved one during the celebration of the Mass is an ancient and honored custom. The manner in which we allow for Mass intentions has become overwhelmed due to the limited number of Masses in a given year. In order to allow more Epiphany families to participate in this practice the following policies have been put into place:

- 1. A family may request only 3 Masses at one time.
- 2. Each family may request only 3 WEEKEND Masses per year.
- 3. All other Mass requests need to be for daily Masses during the week.

In order to give everyone a fair opportunity to request a mass intention, they will only be taken in person, until a reasonable time has passed.

Once again, the Mass intentions for both Easter and Christmas masses will be offered for all parishioners; living and deceased. Mother's and Father's Day intentions will be offered for all mothers and fathers both living and deceased on their particular day.


