Sponsor Letters/Requirements

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. Be at least 16 years of age. Have completed the Sacraments of Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation). If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. You must be registered with our parish for at least 3 months before we will provide a sponsor letter. Although you may have registered with our parish, if you are not attending Mass regularly and using the envelope system there is no way for the parish office to confirm regular Mass attendance. Please contact the Parish Office to confirm your status with our parish.

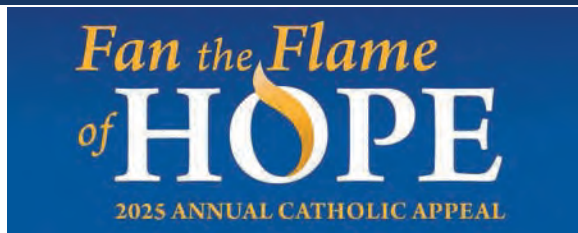

Online Giving

If you prefer to pay bills and manage your finances online, you can set up an account and make your parish offering online via our website. Why Should I use weekly envelopes? The use of envelopes is important, they document your active participation in the faith life of our parish. This also facilitates the preparation of a statement of contributions for income tax purpose.

RE Students: Homily Reflection Books

Homily Reflections: Each student must write 14 Homily Reflections as follows: A minimum of 9 Masses throughout the year as well as 3 Mandatory Masses together with Christmas and Easter Masses. (*Minimum Total of 14 Homily Reflections.*) This is not saying you only have to attend Mass 14 times a year. Sundays are a Holy Day of Obligation and Practicing Catholics are required to attend weekly Mass and all Holy Days.

PEACE TO THIS HOUSE



Gospel: Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

Jesus sent forth seventy-two disciples to preach his good news, telling them "the harvest is rich, but the workers few." He also gave them detailed instructions on how to act towards the people. Jesus then reminded them not to be happy because of their power over evil, but to rejoice in the salvation they would achieve.

At that time Jesus appointed seventy-two others whom he sent ahead of him in pairs to every town and place he intended to visit. He said, 'the harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few, so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest. Go on your way; behold I am sending you like lambs among wolves.'

As I read the gospel passage, I realize that the seventy-two were not sufficient to complete the mission. It was only the beginning. We might think a missionary is one who joins a group and is sent to bring the good news of Jesus to another region or country. That is a limited understanding of the role of a catholic. Because of my baptism my name is added to the seventy-two, as I am commissioned to go on mission. Why? The harvest is ready but as long as I just sit on the sidelines and watch, I am allowing the wolves to devour the sheep. Are you ready to be recommissioned. Pope Saint John Paul II told us 'the mission of Christ the redeemer which He entrusted to His church is far from completion.' Make it 73?
